Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What is a "community cat"?

A community cat is an un-owned cat living outdoors, either independently or in a colony, in a specific area. Typically, they are not socialized (not friendly to humans) and cannot be adopted.

What is the general TNR process?

Trap: Humanely capture a cat with a humane trap provided to you (with a refundable deposit of \$100).

Neuter (or Spay): Take the cat in the trap to a pre-arranged veterinarian to be fixed, vaccinated, and ear-tipped (the universal sign of a fixed cat).

Return: Pick the cat up after recovery, return them to their outdoor home where they were trapped, and return the trap for your deposit.

What are the benefits of TNR?

- Stops mating behaviors (i.e., yowling) and prevents unwanted litters of kittens.
- Reduces euthanasia of newborn kittens who were separated from mom too soon and can't be saved.
- Prevents other breeding cats from moving into an area and reproducing.
- Reduces pest/rodent populations.
- Ensures community cats are vaccinated against rabies.
- Reduces and stabilizes the community cat population over time.
- Improves the lives of community cats.
